

SUSAN H. DANA, CLASS OF 1975



As a student-athlete at K-O, Sue played varsity field hockey, basketball and softball for four years and was captain of all three teams for two years.

She received the most outstanding athlete award in 1975 for field hockey, basketball and softball and won the Best Female Athlete award as well.

Outside of sports, Sue also served as a prefect.

At the University of Vermont, she played varsity basketball for three years, varsity lacrosse for four years and J.V. field hockey for one year. She didn't pick up the sport of lacrosse until college, but served as captain of the varsity lacrosse team at UVM for three of her four years there. Following college, Sue played lacrosse competitively at the club level for 15 years, representing New England at the national tournament for six years and Philadelphia at the national tournament for nine years. She was selected to the U.S. Lacrosse Trials Team the same year she was injured, so she never got a chance to play on the U.S. squad. She also was a selector for the National Lacrosse Tournament.

After Sue injured her knee, she took up competitive cycling and participated in an Olympic Developmental Cycling Camp at the Olympic Center in Lake Placid, N.Y.

She has coached field hockey, basketball and lacrosse at K-O and in Philadelphia.

Her K-O girls varsity basketball team won the KITs two years in a row.
