
Middle School Co-Curricular Registration Form 2025-26

All students are required to participate in a co-curricular program for all three seasons (Fall, Winter, and Spring).

Choreographer Showcase: Developed for students with beginner to advanced dance experience and provides them with the opportunity to work with professional choreographers through a variety of techniques.

Esports: This is an option mirrored after the Varsity Esports program that runs during the Fall season in the Upper School. Students will train in popular titles while developing skills in communication, teamwork, and strategic thinking. Open to both seasoned gamers and newcomers, the team fosters a positive, inclusive environment where students can grow as competitors and collaborators in a rapidly growing field.

Service Learning: Students support our traditional middle school programs like the Giving Tree and Winter Clothing Drive, while also partnering with organizations such as Auer Farm and The Macauley Senior Center. Projects have included solving tech issues for seniors and preparing farm facilities for winter. Each year, students engage in a variety of hands-on service projects that keep the experience meaningful and dynamic.

Studio Art: This is an option for those who have a passion for the visual arts and seek additional time to study and learn. Time in the studio will be spent proposing and working on independent projects that further the skills and voice of each individual artist. Expectations will be that students can work with motivation and focus towards their own artistic goals. A portfolio or series of artwork will be completed by the end of the fall season. Off-campus art trips will occur often to view artwork at the Wadsworth and other local art spaces. Space is limited!

US Sport Application: Exceptionally skilled Middle School student athletes who would like to try out for an Upper School Varsity Team must apply by submitting an application to the Director of Athletics.
